



Ms. Jacqueline Stern has been the conductor of the Elementary Strings for the past fourteen years. She has inspired many of our young musicians to continue on in their musical studies. Mr. Vincent Lionti has been the conductor of the Junior Strings for the past four years. In this short time he has had a positive musical effect on this group by providing the students with challenging music and constant encouragement. To all of our conductors a heart-felt thanks.

Meet the Artists


C. Victor Lionti has been musical director and conductor of the Westchester Youth Symphony since 1970 and is presently a full professor and curriculum chairman of the Music Department at Westchester Community College, Valhalla, New York. He is the founder, conductor, and musical director of the Westchester Community College Camerata Orchestra and is past music director of the Aaron Copland Music Camp. He was formerly principal violist of the Westchester County Symphony and is presently principal violist of the Greenwich Symphony. A graduate of the Eastman School of Music and the Catholic University of America, he taught music at Kent State University in Ohio and was a violist in the Rochester Philharmonic, the United States Marine Band, and the Hartford Symphony.

Considered one of America's foremost youth orchestras, the Westchester Youth Symphony composed of over 130 high school-age instrumentalists chosen by competitive audition each year. The Orchestra has performed throughout the United States and Canada in its 40-year history, including Carnegie Hall, Alice Tully Hall, and as New York State's official musical representative at the Bicentennial Celebration in Philadelphia.

Vincent J. Lionti has been a member of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra since 1987. From 1983 to

1987 he was a member of the **Detroit Symphony Orchestra and** performed with the New York Philharmonic from 1981 to 1983. He was principal violist with the Santa Fe Opera in the summer of 1991 and guest principal violist of Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra in October 1991. He also has been a member of the Casals Festival Orchestra, the Lyric Chamber Ensemble, and the Renaissance City Chamber Ensemble, and the Renaissance City Chamber Players. Lionti holds B.Mus. and M.M. degrees from the Juilliard School, where he was principal violist of each of the school's three orchestras and teaching assistant to William Lincer. In the spring of 1993, Vincent Lionti was appointed conductor and musical director of the Westchester Junior String Orchestra.

Since 1953, the WJSO has been a pioneering organization in music education. The Orchestra was among the first hosts of the Suzuki Talent Education tours in the early 1960s, and has given hundreds of concerts for children through its own annual tours. Recent years have seen concerts and





Division Conferences, NYSSMA State Conferences, scores of colleges and conservatories, Alice Tully Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Carnegie Hall.

Jacqueline Stern has been working with young musicians for 18 as a conductor. instructor, and chamber music coach. She has been the associate director of Suzuki Program Queensborough Community College from 1989 to 1993. Stern is also a performing cellist and has worked with groups that include the Stamford Symphony, the Artek Ensemble, the New York City Opera, the Holy Trinity Bach Orchestra and the Washington Bach Consort. She has a music education degree from Ithaca College and a master's degree in performance from the Manhattan School of music. She is the original conductor of the Elementary String Orchestra. In the twelve years since its founding the group has grown from eight to forty-five members and has expanded its performing schedule to include an annual tour of county schools and an association with the Cassatt String Quartet. The group performed two seasons ago in a special concert at Ellis Island. Last year they performed at Carnegie Hall.

The WESO is the most recent addition to the comprehensive music program provided by the Greater Westchester Youth

Orchestras Association. Founded in 1983, it provides a unique opportunity for young string players in grades four through six to begin their orchestral training. The Westchester Elementary String Orchestra presents concerts each year in County schools and performs at the bi-annual concerts of the GWYOA.




Viviane Travin is this year's winner of the Concerto Competition sponsored by the Greater Westchester Youth Orchestras Association. She is from Chappaqua and is currently a student of Ardyth Alton at the Juilliard School's precollege division. She



started to study the cello in the fifth grade with Barbara Levy. This past January she was chosen to perform in a Juilliard trio in Vero Beach individually and with the ensemble. She received a merit scholarship at Juilliard as well as at the Killington Music Festival in which she has two past the participated for summers. Recently she performed a solo recital at the Juilliard School. Viviane will be one of the soloists with the Yonkers Philharmonic on She won a scholarship June 19. from them this year. Viviane will receive the "Lionti-Lewis Scholarship for Outstanding Musicianship" from Greater Westchester Youth the Association. This Orchestras scholarship was created this year to honor both Mr. C. Victor Lionti and These two Dale Lewis. conductors have devoted a great deal of themselves to the education of young talented musicians.

In addition to pursuing music, Viviane has performed with the Westchester Ballet Company for the past ten years. She hopes to attend a college with a strong arts program when she graduates this year from Horace Greeley High School.
