About The Conductors

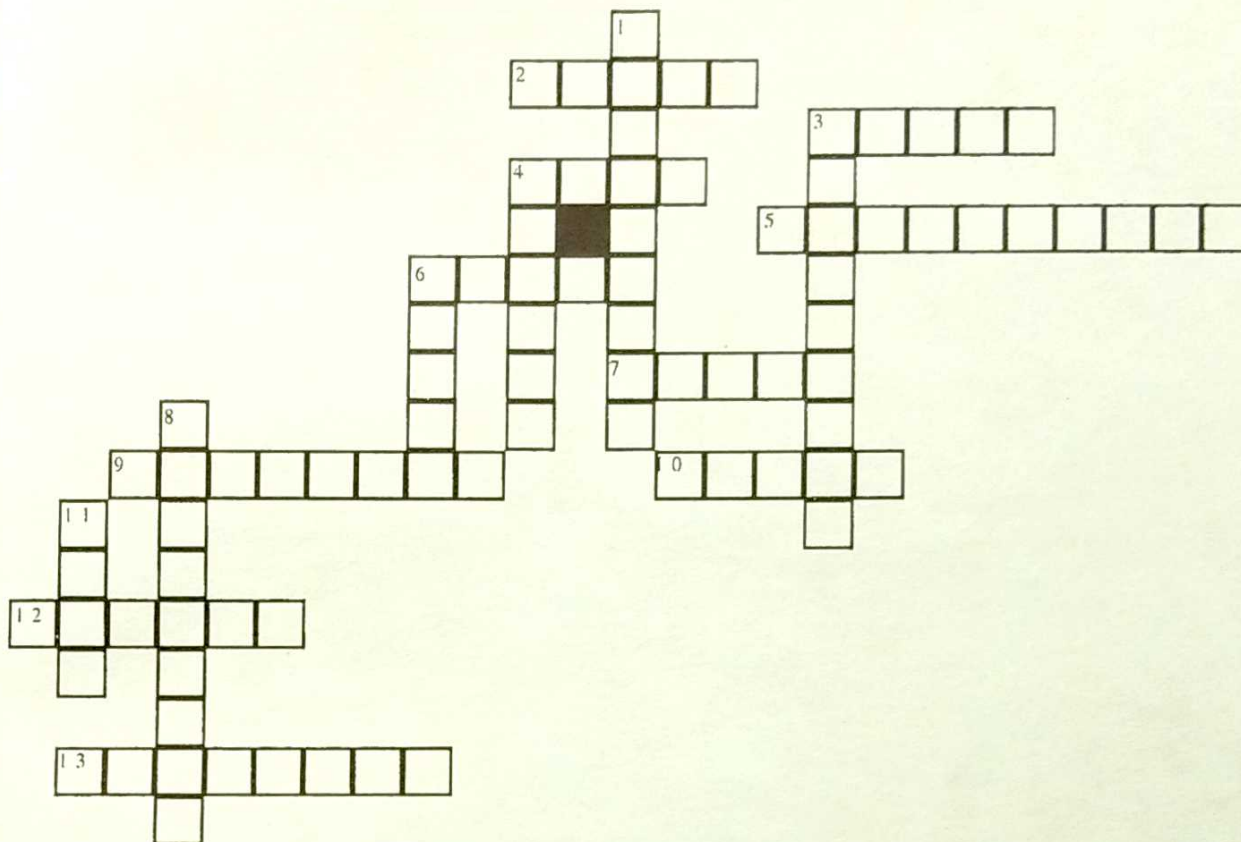
Bernard Klinger has taught elementary strings and orchestra in the Chappaqua Central Schools since 1979; previously he taught in the White Plains Public Schools. He was principal violist in the Ridgefield Symphony and the Camerata. Currently he plays viola in the Greenwich Symphony and the Chappaqua Orchestra. An active member of the Westchester County School Music Association (WCSMA), he has served as coordinator, chairman, conductor, and is now president. Mr. Klinger is a graduate of Hartt College of Music, with degrees in viola performance and music education. He received an M.A. in music education from Teachers College, Columbia University.

Jacqueline Stern has been working with young musicians as a conductor, cello instructor, and chamber music coach. Presently, she conducts the orchestra at the Green Meadow Waldorf School. She was the associate director of the Suzuki program at Queensborough Community College from 1989-1993. She is a performing cellist with the Hudson String Quartet and has worked with groups that include the Stamford Symphony, the Artek Ensemble, the New York City Opera, the Holy Trinity Bach Orchestra and the Washington Bach Consort. Ms. Stern has a music education degree from Ithaca College and a master's degree in performance from the Manhattan School of Music.

Vincent J. Lioni has been a member of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra since 1987. From 1983-1987 he was a member of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra; he performed with the New York Philharmonic from 1981-1983. In 1991, he was principal violist with the Sante Fe Opera and guest principal violist of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. He also has been a member of the Casals Festival Orchestra, the Lyric Chamber Ensemble and the Renaissance City Chamber Ensemble. Mr. Lioni holds B. Mus. and M.M. degrees from the Juilliard School, where he was principal violist and teaching assistant to William Lincer.
