

About The Artists

Bernard Klinger is a graduate of Hartt College of Music, where he received bachelors degrees in Viola Performance, and in Music Education. He received an MA in Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University. Mr. Klinger teaches elementary strings and orchestra in the Chappaqua Central Schools, a position he has held since 1979. Previously, he taught music in the White Plains Schools for seven years. He was principal violist in the Ridgefield, Ct. Symphony, and currently plays viola in the Greenwich Symphony. A Past President of the Westchester County School Music Association (WCSMA), he has also served as Elementary Festival Coordinator, orchestra chairman, and in 1991 was the conductor of the Elementary Orchestra. Active in GWYOA, Mr. Klinger has been Vice President of the Board of Directors, led sectional rehearsals, judged concerto competitions, and served as substitute conductor of the Elementary and Junior Strings.

Jacqueline Stern has been working with young musicians as a conductor, cello instructor, and chamber music coach. Presently, she conducts the orchestra at the Green Meadow Waldorf School. She was the associate director of the Suzuki program at Queensborough Community College from 1989-1993. She is a performing cellist with the Hudson String Quartet and has worked with groups that include the Stamford Symphony, the Artek Ensemble, the New York City Opera, the Holy Trinity Bach Orchestra and the Washington Bach Consort. Ms. Stern has a music education degree from Ithaca College and a master's degree in performance from the Manhattan School of Music.

Vincent J. Lionti has been a member of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra since 1987. From 1983-1987 he was a member of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra; he performed with the New York Philharmonic form 1981-1983. In 1991, he was principal violist with the Sante Fe Opera and guest principal violist of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. He also has been a member of the Casals Festival Orchestra, the Lyric Chamber Ensemble and the Renaissance City Chamber Ensemble. Mr. Lionti holds B. Mus. And M.M. degrees from the Juilliard School, where he was principal violist and teaching assistant to William Lincer.

Spencer Lutchen (trombone soloist) has been a member of the Westchester Youth Symphony since 1998. He has been playing the trombone since the fourth grade, under the tutelage of Fred ('Moe') Snyder. Since entering high school, Spencer has played first trombone in the Area All-State Concert Band and Orchestra, as well as in the Westchester All-County Concert Band, Orchestra and Jazz Band. For the past two years he has been a member of the New York All-State Instrumental Jazz Ensemble, and was first trombone this past year. He has participated in the NYS Summer School for the Performing Arts in Saratoga, NY, and at the Tanglewood Institute in Massachusetts. A senior in Harrison HS, Spencer is a member of the school's Marching Band, Concert Band, Dixieland Band, and Jazz & Swing Bands. An academic standout at Harrison HS, Spencer is a member of the National and French Honor Societies, recently won the US Air Force Award for excellence for his Intel Science Research Paper, and will be graduating fourth in his class. He will be attending Williams College in the fall where he plans to continue his academic and musical studies, including playing with the Berkshire Symphony Orchestra.
