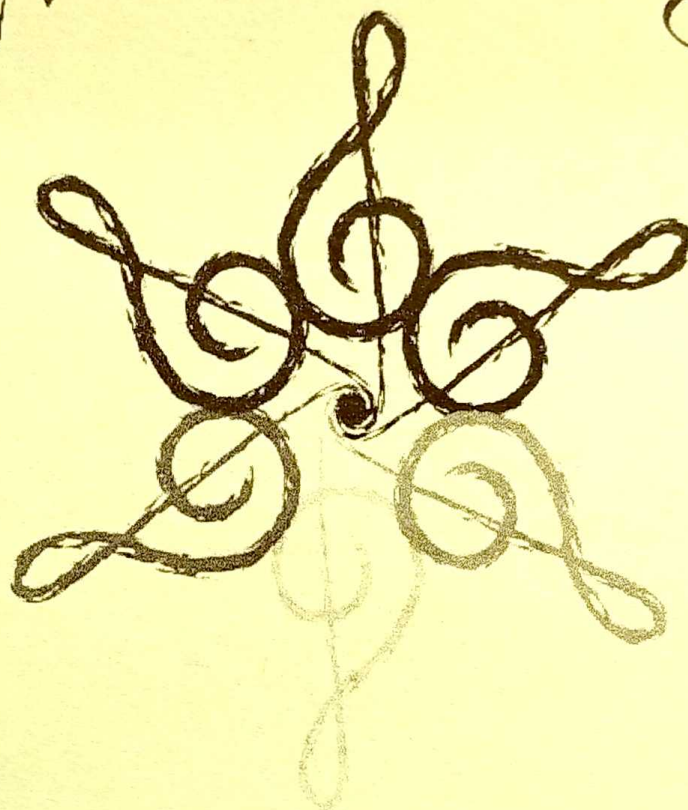

About the Conductors

Bernard Klinger is a graduate of Hartt College of Music, where he received Bachelors degrees in Viola performance and Music Education. He has a Masters degree in Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University. Mr. Klinger currently teaches strings and orchestra at Holland Hill School in Fairfield, Connecticut. Previously, he taught strings and orchestra in the Chappaqua, NY schools for 26 years and in the White Plains, NY schools for seven years. He was principal violist in the Ridgefield, Ct. Symphony, and currently plays viola in the Greenwich Symphony. A past president of the Westchester County School Music Association (WCSMA), he has also served as Elementary Festival Coordinator, orchestra chairman, Elementary Orchestra Conductor and Advisor to the Board.

Jacqueline Stern has a music education degree from Ithaca College and a Masters degree in performance from the Manhattan School of Music. She has been working with young musicians as a conductor, cello instructor and chamber music coach. Presently, she conducts the orchestra at the Green Meadow Waldorf School. Ms. Stern was the associate director of the Suzuki program at Queensborough Community College from 1989-1993. She is a performing cellist with the Hudson String Quartet and has worked with groups that include the Stamford Symphony, the Artek Ensemble, the New York City Opera, the Holy Trinity Bach Orchestra and the Washington Bach Consort.

Vincent J. Lioni holds a Bachelors degree of Music and Masters degree of Music from The Julliard School where he was principal violist and teaching assistant to William Lincer. He has been a member of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra since 1987. From 1983-1987 he was a member of the Detroit Symphony and he performed with the New York Philharmonic from 1981-1983. Mr Lioni has performed as the principal violist with the Santa Fe Opera and guest principal violist of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. He has also been a member of the Casals Festival Orchestra, the Lyric Chamber Ensemble and the Renaissance City Chamber Ensemble.



About GWYOA

Mr. Harry Alshin, sowed the seeds for the GWYOA in 1955. Mr. Alshin first organized and conducted a countywide orchestra for junior high school students, preparing the young participants for the first youth orchestra which was established 2 years later.

The Youth Symphony, a high school age group, has had only 5 conductors since its inception including Victor Lioni who took over the baton in 1970 and maintained it for 25 years. His son, Vincent Lioni started with GWYOA as a student violist at the age of 12. He became the Junior Strings Conductor in 1990 and moved on to lead the Youth Symphony when his father retired. The Elementary String Orchestra was organized in 1983 and was first conducted by Jacqueline Stern who now leads the Junior String Orchestra. In 1996 Bernard Klinger joined the GWYOA as the conductor of the Elementary Strings.

GWYOA is currently sponsored by Westchester Community College. The organization has a long tradition of providing young musicians with a place to learn and perform and has graduated 50 years of talented young players, some of whom have gone on to perform with world famous orchestras including the NY Philharmonic, the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and the Jerusalem Symphony.

Performance venues for the GWYOA have included: Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall @ Lincoln Center, Alice Tully Hall @ Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center, SUNY Purchase, NYSSMA State Conferences, Ellis Island, 1976 Bicentennial celebration in Philadelphia, and various local hospitals, nursing homes and schools. In April of 2006 the Youth Symphony will play at the new White Plains Performing Arts Center as part of the "Downtown Music at Grace" series.
